DEFINITIONS & METHODOLOGY

Cash receipts for agricultural commodities are defined as the gross income from sales of crops, livestock, and livestock products during a calendar year. The USDA, Economic Research Service (ERS) uses USDA, National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) estimates to develop state level cash receipts. The county level cash receipts in this publication are based on the ERS state level cash receipts and various NASS county data. To ensure respondent confidentiality, estimates at any level, including county estimates, are not published if those estimates would disclose any information about individual operations. 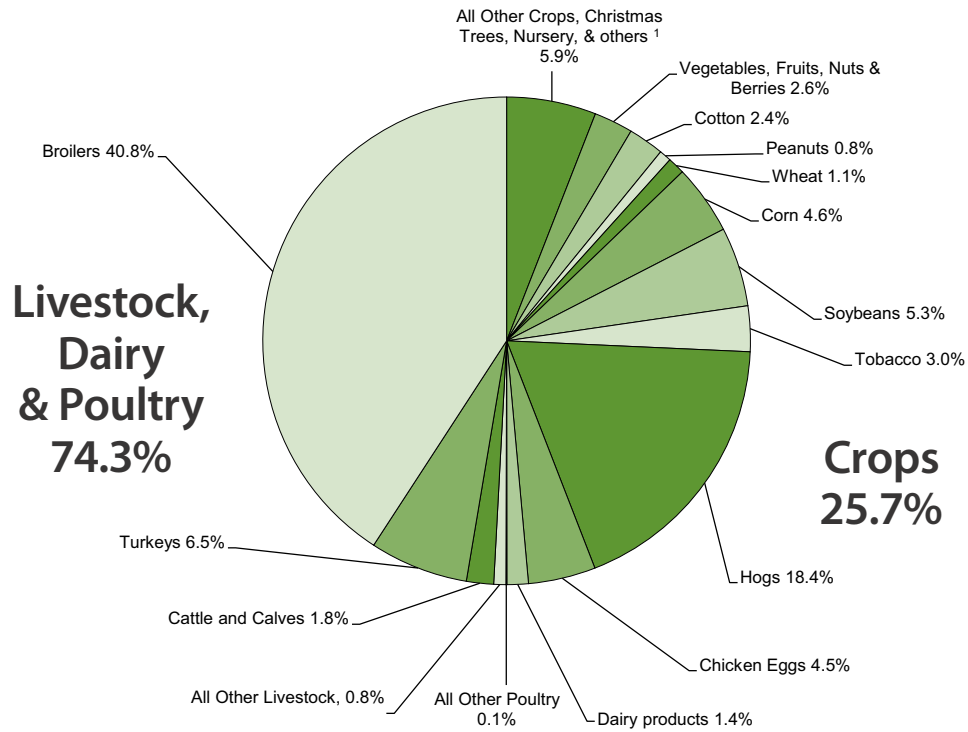

SOURCE OF FARM CASH RECEIPTS, NORTH CAROLINA, 2022

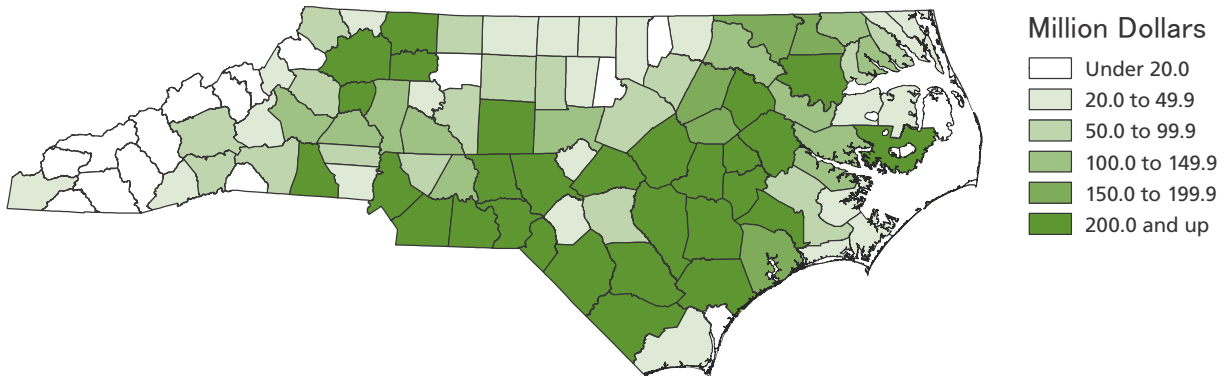

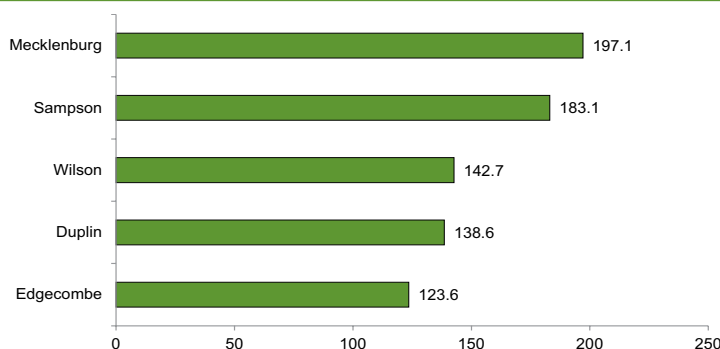

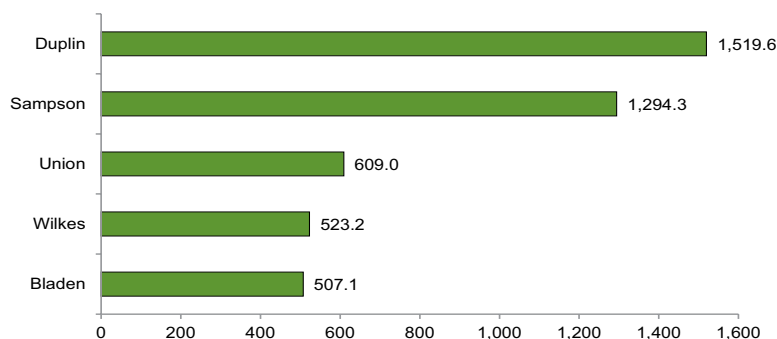
CROPS CASH RECEIPTS LEADING COUNTIES

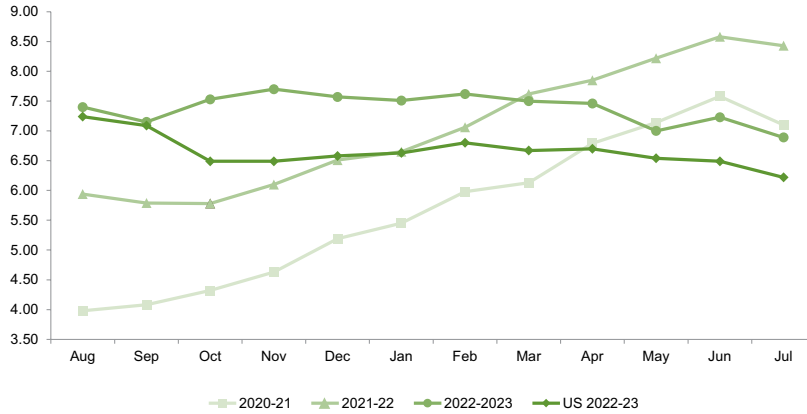

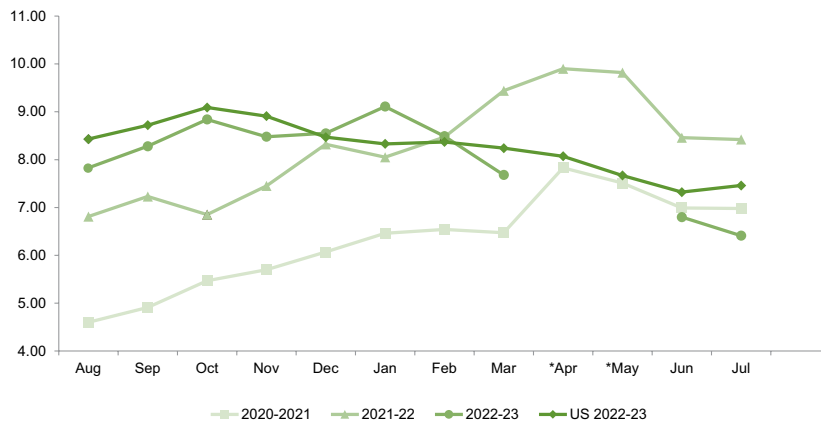

MONTHLY PRICE RECEIVED FOR CORN (Dollars per Bushel)

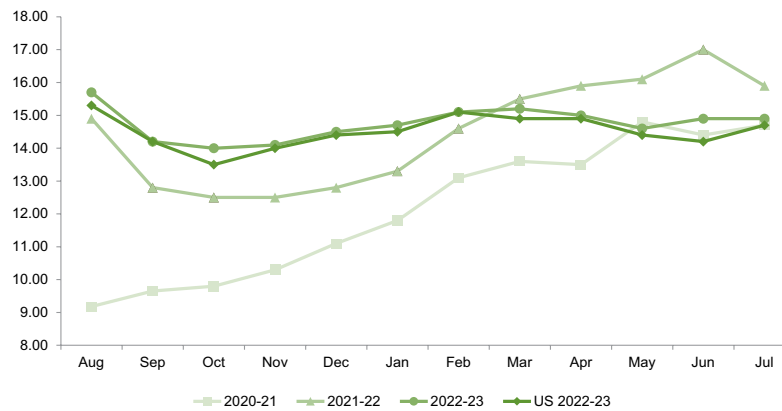


MONTHLY PRICE RECEIVED FOR WINTER WHEAT (Dollars per Bushel)
