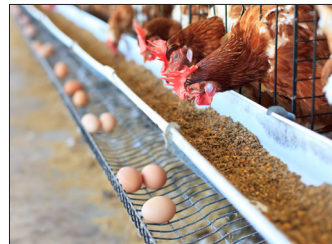

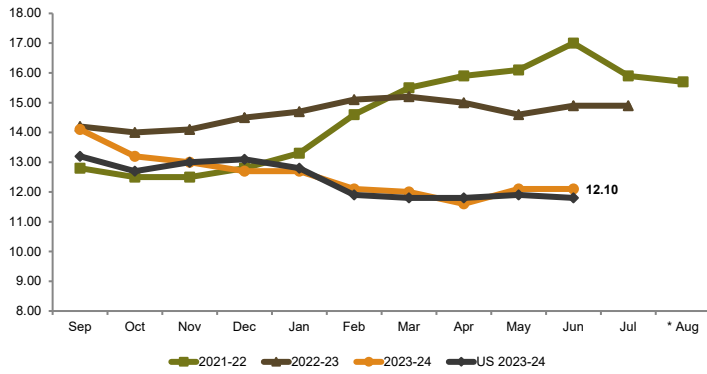

### MONTHLY PRICE RECEIVED FOR SOYBEANS

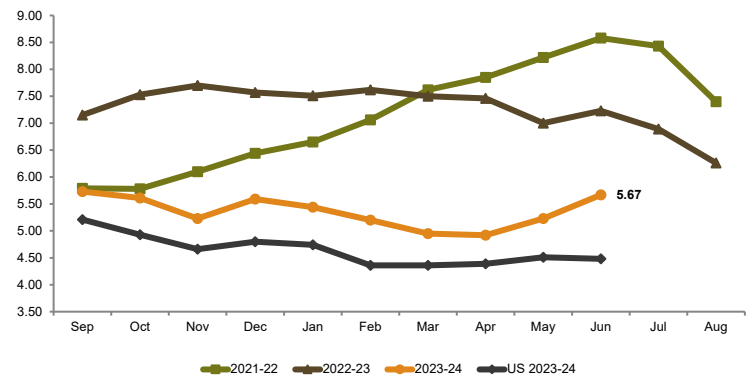
(Dollars per Bushel)

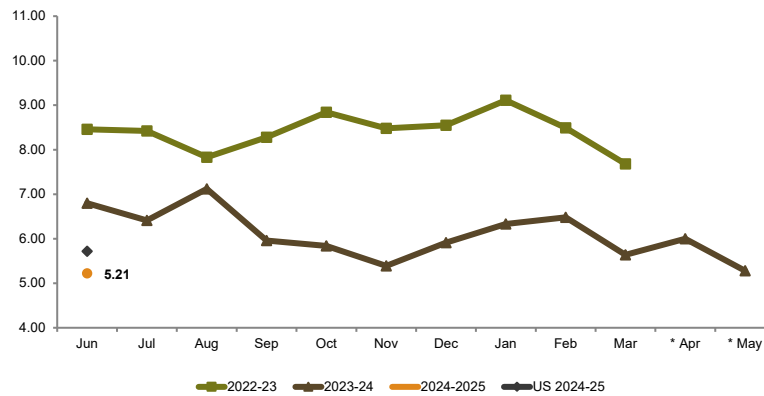
### MONTHLY PRICE RECEIVED FOR CORN

(Dollars per Bushel)



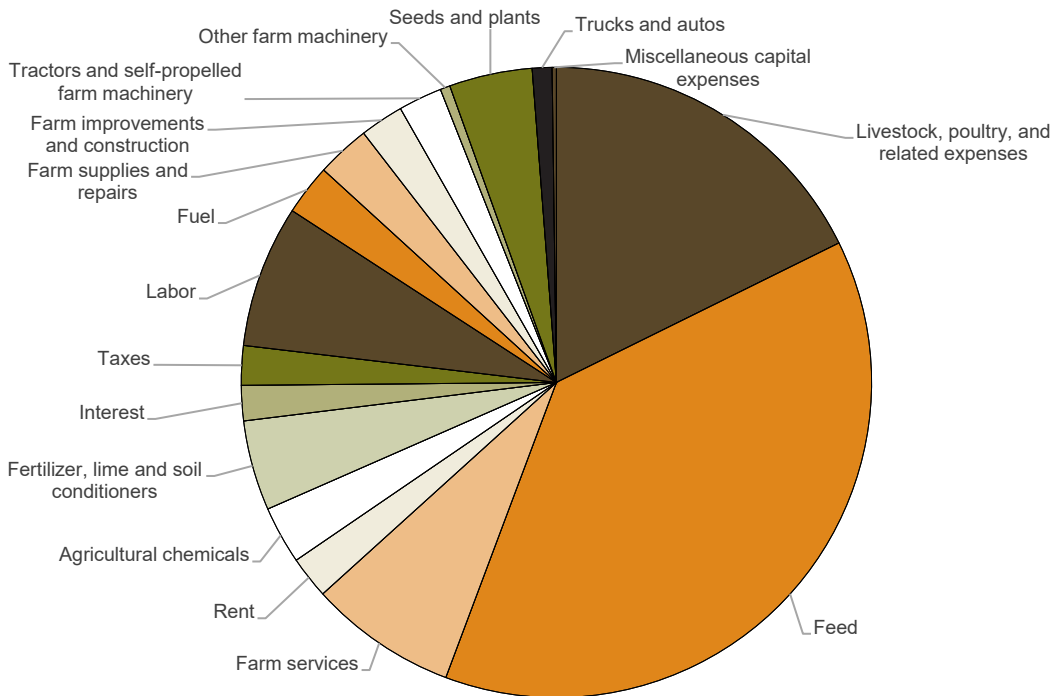

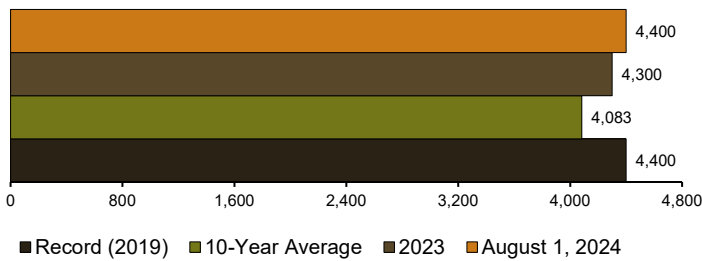

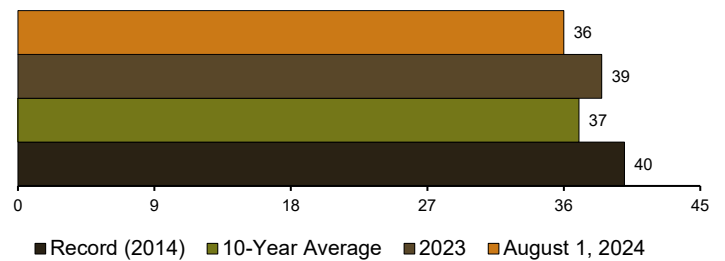

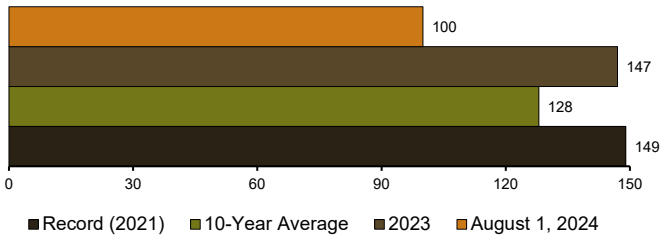
### PEANUT YIELD (Pounds)



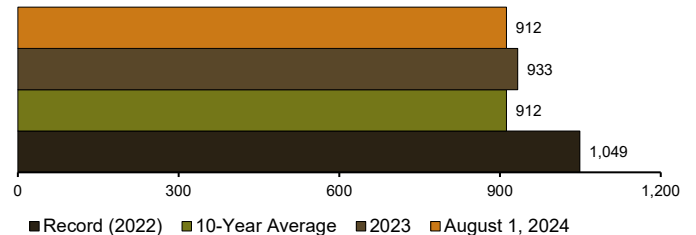
### SOYBEAN YIELD (Bushels)



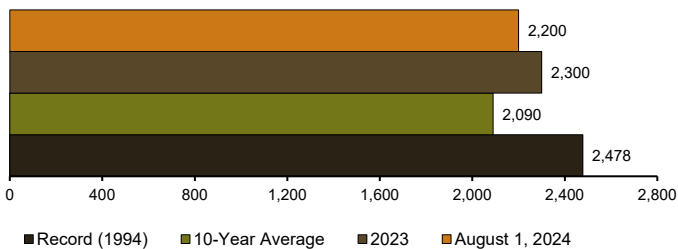
