NORTH DAKOTA CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

FARGO, N.D. March 31, 2025 - For the week ending March 30, 2025, topsoil moisture supplies rated 19% very short, 35% short, 44% adequate, and 2% surplus, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 22% very short, 32% short, 44% adequate, and 2% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 3% very poor, 23% poor, 36% fair, 38% good, and 0% excellent.

Livestock Report: Cattle and calf conditions rated 1% very poor, 2% poor, 26% fair, 63% good, and 8% excellent. Cattle and calf death loss rated 1% heavy, 55% average, and 44% light. Calving progress was 33% complete, near 35% for both last year and the five-year average.

Sheep and lamb conditions rated 1% very poor, 2% poor, 26% fair, 66% good, and 5% excellent. Sheep and lamb death loss rated 4% heavy, 50% average, and 46% light. Lambing progress was 53% complete, behind 59% last year, and near 57% average. Shearing progress was 58% complete, behind 71% last year and 73% average.

Hay and roughage supplies rated 8% very short, 13% short, 75% adequate, and 4% surplus.

Stock water supplies rated 14% very short, 25% short, 59% adequate, and 2% surplus.

Weely reports will begin April 7th for the 2025 season.
