Ohio November Agricultural Prices

Prices Received by Ohio farmers for the full month of November 2024 are listed in the table below.

Some Ohio highlights were: November corn, at \$4.03 per bushel, increased \$0.21 from October but decreased \$0.37 from last year; November soybeans, at \$10.10 per bushel, increased \$0.12 from last month but decreased \$3.00 from last year; November wheat, at \$5.24 per bushel, decreased \$0.16 from October and decreased \$0.08 from last year; November milk, at \$25.30 per cwt., decreased \$0.70 from last month but increased \$2.70 from last year.

Nationally, the November Prices Received Index 2011 Base (Agricultural Production), at 120.2, increased 6.8 percent from October and 5.4 percent from November 2023. At 94.6, the Crop Production Index is up 5.7 percent from last month but down 6.8 percent from the previous year. The Livestock Production Index, at 158.8, increased 2.5 percent from October and 19 percent from November last year. Producers received higher prices during November for lettuce, market eggs, grapes, and broccoli but lower prices for milk, soybeans, onions, and hay. In addition to prices, the volume change of commodities marketed also influences the indexes. In November, there was increased monthly movement for corn, cattle, market eggs, and milk and decreased marketing of soybeans, grapes, wheat, and lettuce.
