

This report contains results from the September 2024 Cattle on Feed Survey collected during the first two weeks of September. Data provided by Oklahoma and Texas producers are the foundation of the estimates made for the Southern Plains region. We would like to thank all producers who responded to the survey. Results from the next monthly survey will be made available on October 25, 2024.

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in **Texas** feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 2.75 million head on September 1, 2024, up slightly from a year ago. Producers placed 415 thousand head in commercial feedlots during August, down 6 percent from a year ago. Texas commercial feeders marketed 390 thousand head during August, down 4 percent from 2023.

On September 1, there were 2.46 million head of cattle and calves on feed in the Northern High Plains, 89 percent of the state's total. The number on feed across the area was up 1 percent from last year but unchanged from the August 1 total. August placements in the Northern High Plains totaled 373 thousand head, up 9 percent from the July total. Marketings were down 6 percent from last month at 349 thousand head.




¹ Cattle and calves on feed are animals for slaughter market being fed a ration of grain or other concentrates and are expected to produce a carcass that will grade select or better.

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in **Oklahoma** feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 330 thousand head on September 1, 2024, up 25 percent from a year ago. Producers placed 50 thousand head in commercial feedlots during August, up 16 percent from a year ago. Oklahoma commercial feeders marketed 44 thousand head during August, up 38 percent from 2023. Other disappearance during August totaled 1 thousand head, unchanged from a year ago.
