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

This will be the last monthly Southern Plains Region Cattle on Feed report.

This report contains results from the April 2025 Cattle on Feed Survey collected during the first two weeks of April. Data provided by Oklahoma and Texas producers are the foundation of the estimates made for the Southern Plains region. We would like to thank all producers who responded to the survey. Results from the next monthly survey will be made available on May 23, 2025.

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in **Texas** feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 2.67 million head on April 1, 2025, down 6 percent from a year ago. Producers placed 370 thousand head in commercial feedlots during March, up 1 percent from a year ago. Texas commercial feeders marketed 330 thousand head during March, unchanged from 2024.

On April 1, there were 2.38 million head of cattle and calves on feed in the Northern High Plains, 89 percent of the state's total. The number on feed across the area was down 6 percent from last year but up 1 percent from the March 1 total. March placements in the Northern High Plains totaled 332 thousand head, up 44 percent from the February total. Marketings were up 9 percent from last month at 297 thousand head.





Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in **Oklahoma** feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 335 thousand head on April 1, 2025, up 2 percent from a year ago. Producers placed 40 thousand head in commercial feedlots during March, down 2 percent from a year ago. Oklahoma commercial feeders marketed 44 thousand head during March, up 10 percent from 2024. Other disappearance during March totaled 1 thousand head, unchanged from a year ago.
