Pennsylvania Weekly Crop Weather – November 27th, 2016:

Pennsylvania had another good week for field activities with an average of 5.5 days suitable for field work. Temperatures were reported with a high of 56°(F), a low of 15°(F) and a state average temperature of 34°(F). Unstable weather conditions are expected this week and temperatures continue to drop as the end of the season approaches. With the season close to an end, most harvests have been completed. Most corn and soybean harvests have finished. Field activities for the week included fertilizing and seeding.
