SOUTH DAKOTA CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

SIOUX FALLS, S.D. May 5, 2025 - For the week ending May 4, 2025, there were 4.6 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 17% very short, 39% short, 43% adequate, and 1% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 21% very short, 51% short, 27% adequate, and 1% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Corn planted was 39%, well ahead of 17% last year, and ahead of 23% for the five-year average. Emerged was 4%, near 1% both last year and average.

Soybeans planted was 25%, ahead of 9% both last year and average.

Winter wheat condition rated 10% very poor, 24% poor, 41% fair, 25% good, and 0% excellent.

Spring wheat planted was 94%, ahead of 77% last year, and well ahead of 63% average. Emerged was 45%, ahead of 28% last year, and well ahead of 24% average.

Oats planted was 87%, ahead of 73% last year, and well ahead of 65% average. Emerged was 42%, ahead of 36% last year and 27% average.

Sorghum planted was 8%, behind 15% last year, but near 6% average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 11% very poor, 27% poor, 47% fair, 14% good, and 1% excellent.
