Tennessee Wheat Production down 24% from 2023

According to the Tennessee Field Office of the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service **Tennessee** farmers expect to produce 23.6 million bushels of **winter wheat** from 310,000 acres for harvest this season. At this level, production would be down 24% from 2023. Based upon crop conditions as of July 1, growers expect a yield of 76.0 bushels per acre, down 4.0 bushels from 2023.

Winter wheat production for the **Nation** was forecast at 1.34 billion bushels, up 4% from the June 1 forecast and up 7% from 2023. Based on July 1 conditions, the United States yield is forecast at 52.0 bushels per acre, up 0.6 bushel from last month and up 1.4 bushels from last year. The expected area to be harvested for grain or seed totals 25.8 million acres, up 5% from last year.
