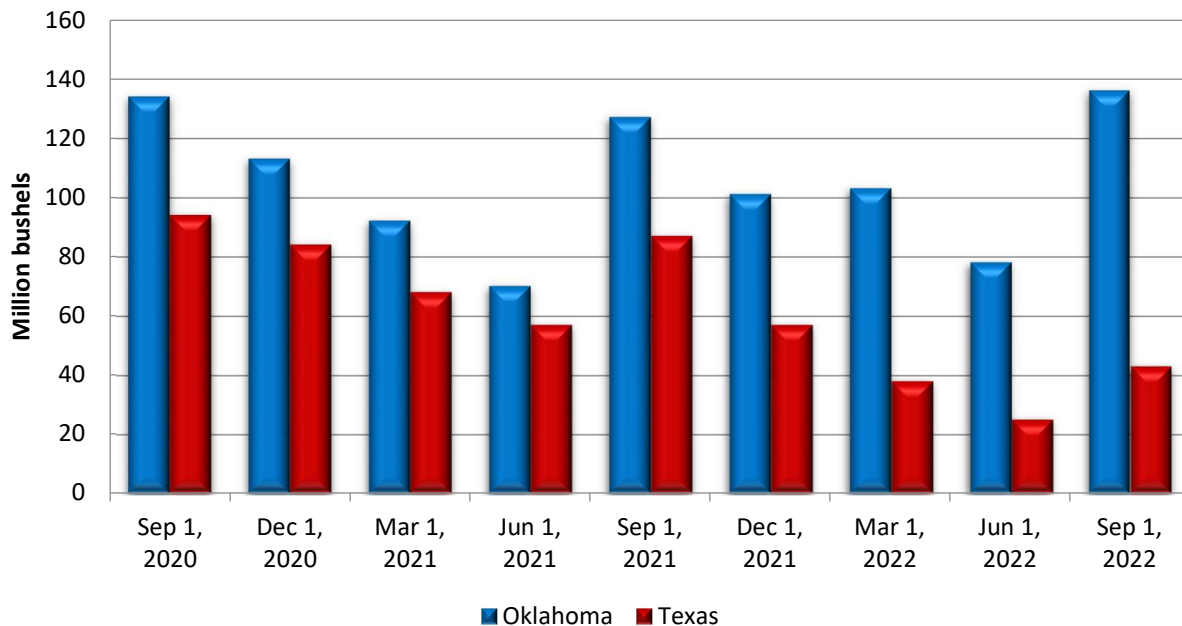

The grain stocks estimates in this report are based on surveys conducted during the first two weeks of September. Data provided by Oklahoma and Texas producers, as well as licensed grain storage facilities, are the foundation of the estimates made for the Southern Plains region. Separate surveys are conducted to obtain the on-farm and off-farm estimates. We would like to thank everyone who responded to the survey. Results from the next quarterly survey will be available on January 12, 2023.

Oklahoma stocks of wheat in all positions on September 1 totaled 136 million bushels, up 7 percent from the 2021 level of 127 million bushels. Off-farm wheat stocks, at 129 million bushels, were 12 percent higher than September 1, 2021.

Texas stocks of wheat in all positions on September 1, at 42.8 million bushels, were down 51 percent from the 2021 level of 87.2 million bushels. Off-farm wheat stocks, at 39.4 million bushels, were 51 percent lower than September 1, 2021.

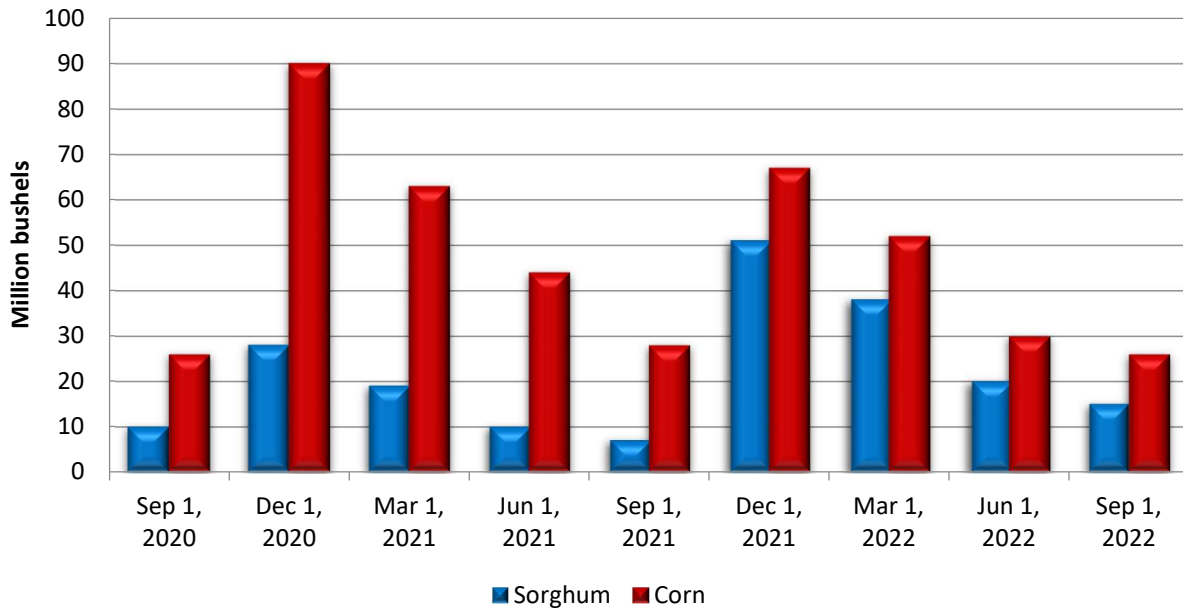
Quarterly Wheat Stocks

Texas off-farm sorghum stocks totaled 14.6 million bushels. On-farm stocks for sorghum totaled 120 thousand bushels on September 1, 2022.

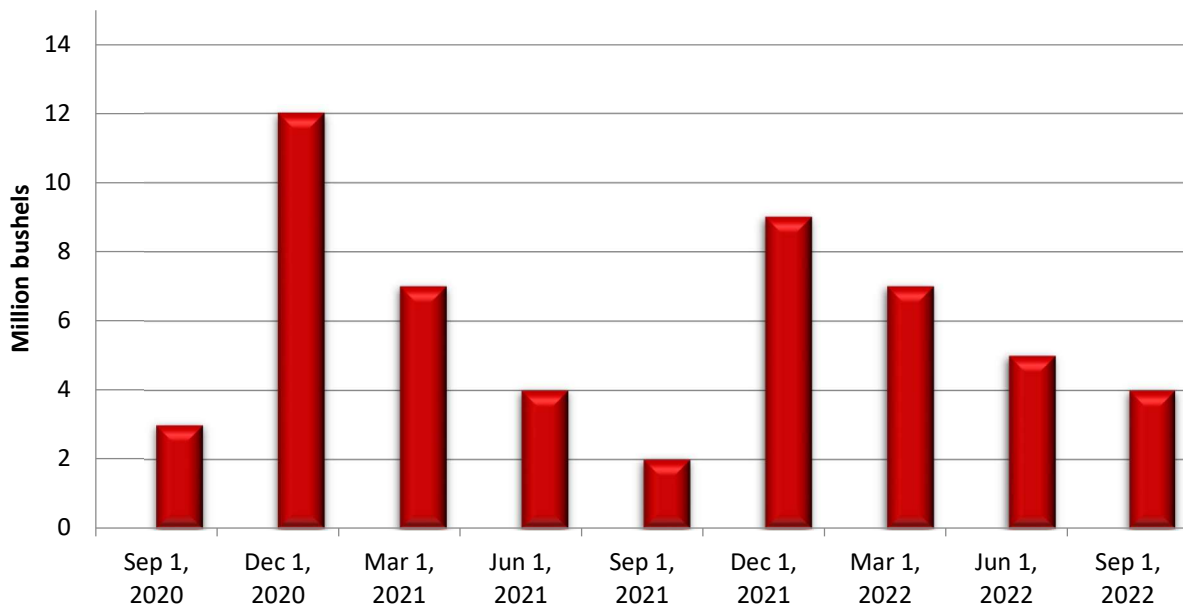
Texas off-farm corn stocks, at 25.8 million bushels, were down 9 percent from last year. On-farm stocks for corn are not published for the state.

Oklahoma off-farm corn stocks, at 3.78 million bushels, were up 67 percent from a year earlier. On-farm stocks for corn are not published for the state.

U.S. Highlights: Total stocks of corn in the United States on September 1, 2022 were 1.38 billion bushels, 12 percent higher than September 1, 2021. All wheat stocks were estimated at 1.78 billion bushels in all positions, up slightly from last September. U.S. stocks of sorghum totaled 53.2 million bushels, 162 percent above September 1, 2021. Stocks of soybeans in all positions totaled 274 million bushels, up 7 percent from last year.
