



The January 1, 2022, Texas grapefruit production is forecast at 1.60 million boxes for the 2021-2022 season, down 33 percent from last year's final production of 2.40 million boxes. All orange production is forecast at 400 thousand boxes, down 62 percent from last year's final production of 1.05 million boxes. Early and midseason oranges account for 300 thousand boxes and Valencias account for 100 thousand boxes.
