

This report contains results from the January 2025 Cattle on Feed Survey collected during the first two weeks of January. Data provided by Oklahoma and Texas producers are the foundation of the estimates made for the Southern Plains region. We would like to thank all producers who responded to the survey. Results from the next monthly survey will be made available on February 21, 2025.

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in **Texas** feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 2.78 million head on January 1, 2025, down 3 percent from a year ago. Producers placed 255 thousand head in commercial feedlots during December, down 23 percent from a year ago. Texas commercial feeders marketed 345 thousand head during December, down 5 percent from 2024.

On January 1, there were 2.48 million head of cattle and calves on feed in the Northern High Plains, 89 percent of the state's total. The number on feed across the area was down 2 percent from last year and down 4 percent from the December 1 total. December placements in the Northern High Plains totaled 224 thousand head, down 28 percent from the November total. Marketings were up 3 percent from last month at 306 thousand head.



Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in Oklahoma feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 360 thousand head on January 1, 2025, up 7 percent from a year ago. Producers placed 35 thousand head in commercial feedlots during December, down 19 percent from a year ago. Oklahoma commercial feeders marketed 39 thousand head during December, up 22 percent from 2024. Other disappearance during December totaled 1 thousand head, unchanged from a year ago.
