CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION WEEK ENDING JULY 7, 2019

AGRICULTURAL SUMMARY: Utah continued to experience drier and warmer weather throughout the state during the past week, according to the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. Topsoil moisture level conditions rated adequate to surplus decreased from 77 percent last week to 72 percent. Box Elder and Beaver Counties reported producers were working on the second cutting of alfalfa. Box Elder County reported fruit producers are beginning to harvest cherries and apricots. Statewide, winter wheat condition was rated 57 percent good to excellent, compared to 44 percent rated good to excellent last year. Stock water supplies were rated 2 percent short, 82 percent adequate, and 16 percent surplus. Irrigation water supplies were rated 4 percent fair, 64 percent good, and 32 percent excellent.
