

#### Weather Summary- For the week ending April 20, 2025

Monday began mostly sunny, and warmed to well above normal temperatures ahead of the next cold front. The front crossed over West Virginia Monday evening into Tuesday, accompanied by showers and thunderstorms. A few showers/storms continued into Tuesday, but moved off to the east by the afternoon. Wednesday and Thursday were much cooler, but clear under high pressure. Temperatures began to climb back closer to normal Thursday afternoon. Friday was dry and warm, and Saturday continued to be dry and hot. Some temperatures reached 90 on Saturday. Sunday cooled off again as a weak cold system moved over the state. By the end of the week, all stations reported above normal temperatures. Most of the state was drier than usual. Beckley was the exception and ended above normal.

Temperatures: Williamson had the highest recorded temperature of 90 degrees. Elkins had the lowest recorded temperature of 26 degrees. The state average temperature was 60 degrees.

Precipitation: Beckley had the highest recorded amount of precipitation with 0.94 inches. Wheeling had the lowest with zero recorded precipitation. The state average precipitation was 0.48 inches.

Drought Conditions: Abnormally dry (D0) conditions over eastern mountains. Moderate drought (D1) and severe drought (D2) over the Eastern Panhandle.
